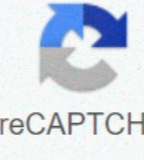

External media links associated with Hilltops Council in the Commons came from NSW Council areas (local government areas/LGA). An independent body providing NSW government departments released its assessment to 134 state councils and 11 joint organisations on Friday.The NSW Auditor-General's report says: The number of high-risk issues reported in our management letters has decreased. [However, there are] five councils without an asset management strategy, policy and plan. This improved compared to the previous year. Auditor-General Margaret Crawford says in the report that there are very nice indicators of gradual strengthening of management and financial oversight of the sector. Information technology was the biggest issue raised by the audit (41 percent). As for Byron Council, it was considered unaltoned from previous estimates, and they filed their financial statements before the statutory deadline. Four NSW councils were listed as a modified opinion: a qualified opinion, an unfavorable opinion or a cautionary opinion. They are the Council (Botanical Bay), Bay), Council (Southwest Slopes), Middle Coast Council and Murrumbidgee Council (Riverina District). Tags: NSW Hilltops Council was threatened with suspension by Local Government Minister Shelley Hancock, after the Council failed to submit its 2017/2018 financial figures on time and after receiving an extension. The CEO of Hilltops Council has placed the report on the agenda of an extraordinary meeting to be held in Young at 5.30pm this Wednesday. It says: A significant amount of work was done in conjunction with several audits on the territory of 29/1 - 1 February 2019 and 1 - 2 August to finally resolve all issues and verified applications were uploaded to the State Audit Service on Friday 6 September 2019. Unfortunately, on the same day, the Council received a Notice of Intent to issue a notice of improved efficiency regarding the 2017/18 accounts. The Minister appealed to the Council as to why this Performance Notice should not be issued. The Board is obliged to submit its financial statements in conjunction with the annual report to the Minister within four months after the end of the previous financial year. This means that the report was due to be submitted by October 2019. Almost 11 months ago, Local Government Minister Shelley Hancock criticised Hilltops Council's speech and threatened the Council with removal. Hilltops Mayor Brian Ingram and Hilltops general manager Edwina Marks. In a letter to the minister addressed to Mayor Brian Ingram and General Manager Edwina Marks, states the Notice of Intent to issue a Performance Improvement Order to Hilltops Council under Section 438A of the Local Government Act 1993 Under Section 438C of the Local Government Act 1993 (Act), I give notice of my intention to issue a Performance Enhancement Order (PIO) under Section 438A of the Act, for actions to be taken, as defined in the DRAFT PIO, to improve the implementation of the Council. I have serious concerns that the Council's failure to file its audited financial statements for 2017-18 within four months of the statutory period demonstrates that it is not functioning effectively. Disclosing the board's financial statements is a crucial way in which it remains accountable to its rates. Terms of financial statements in accordance with the Law are not mandatory, obligations. Each council in the NHSU must comply with these obligations, and each council in the NHSU short time to return their financial statements. The board has been invited to submit a submission to the Minister regarding the proposed PIO and will most likely do so as a formal resolution.
